## <u>Global Chemicals Industry 2025: Reinvention, Innovation, and</u> <u>Sustainability at Full Throttle</u>

### <u>Global PET Prices Exhibit</u> <u>Mixed Trends Amid Seasonal</u> <u>Shifts</u>

In early February 2025, Polyethylene Terephthalate (PET) prices displayed varied movements across regions due to seasonal factors and fluctuating demand. Europe saw a 1.74% increase in PET prices, driven by rising production costs and renewed demand from the beverage sector as temperatures climbed. In contrast, Asia experienced a 1.24% decline in PET prices, attributed to subdued consumption during the Lunar New Year and decreased manufacturing activity.

## <u>Illinois Legislators Renew</u> <u>Effort to Ban Harmful Food</u> <u>Additives</u>

Illinois lawmakers are reintroducing the Food Safety Act to prohibit four food additives—brominated vegetable oil, red dye No. 3, potassium bromate, and propylparaben—linked to health risks like cancer and behavioral issues. The bill, led by Sen. Willie Preston, D-Chicago, has bipartisan support and aligns with recent FDA actions and bans in Europe and Australia. Advocates emphasize the need for state-level action to ensure food safety.
